

The mission of NWS is to help students acquire the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to become happy, healthy, well-adjusted and productive citizens of the world.





The Curriculum and Learning

Lifelong learning is the corner stone of all academic planning and activities at NWS. The School provides a comprehensive academic curriculum supported by a process of teaching for learning that encourages students to develop skills of critical thinking, problem solving, communication, collaboration and creativity.



Cambridge University Press text books and teacher handbooks and the NCERT Text books, or other recommended text book resources are used throughout the School. The syllabus is enriched by well-structured lesson plans, the use of active learning strategies, teacher designed worksheets and lesson specific activities ensuring that the students are equipped with knowledge, skills, understanding and values.

Assessments take place in line with Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE) and CBSE norms, where both formative and summative assessment play an important role.



Enhancing the Curriculum


The reading programme at NWS is being developed to

- support the holistic development of each student.
- provide a rich and stimulating reading environment, while enhancing exposure to and developing understanding of English.
- foster an enthusiasm for and love of reading for life, encouraging children to become attentive listeners, independent and reflective readers.
- read and listen to a range of texts including fiction, non-fiction, playscripts and poetry.
- develop reading strategies and skills, accuracy, fluency, understanding, enjoyment and a critical response to texts.

Parents are encouraged to read aloud to their children on a daily basis, listen to them read and support their reading for at least 20 minutes a day as they become proficient readers.

The Academic Curriculum is enhanced by:

- The integration of Technology, whereby teaching and learning is supported by the latest multimedia technology and digital content, mapped to the curriculum. Teachers may use online learning resources and links to either explain a concept or evaluate the understanding of the students.
- Khan Academy, whereby the Indian Curriculum for Mathematics has been mapped to the resources available for students' usage on Khan Academy, USA. NWS has adopted the lesson aligned practice model, whereby exercises are set by the teachers for the class as regular practice to build procedural fluency and concept development.
- An enhanced German Language programme, supported by the "Goethe Institut", Max Müller Bhavan, the education wing of German Embassy, providing a pathway for students to study in Germany.

- Start-Up-Superstars, an inter-class event to create globally aware, socially responsible, young entrepreneurs, through which students set up and plan businesses which:
 - give students the chance to gain hands-on experience of running a real business.
 - generate real profits to help support their educational activities.
 - are sustainable and will grow and develop every year.Start-Up-Superstars and the curriculum are closely mapped to ensure that the practical experiences enhance conceptual learning.
- The use of do-it-yourself science kits, designed helping students to become logical thinkers and problem solvers and enhance analytical intelligence through visualisation of challenging scientific concepts.
- Generation Global, a compelling educational programme that engages school students across the world in learning directly with, from and about each other. By means of video-conferencing and an online community, students from different parts of the world work together to investigate specific global issues; discuss a range of opinions, values and beliefs; and explore the reasons for similar and different views.

Developing All Round Excellence

The Academic Curriculum is enriched by an extensive programme of clubs, house activities, monthly events, annual productions as well as opportunities to participate in inter-school competitions. Students are encouraged to explore all facets of their personality, to explore new activities and develop their talents to the full.

The Student Council offers leadership opportunities to students of classes V to XII. They develop their leadership abilities through discussion, debate and taking the initiative on a host of issues relevant to their life at school and beyond.

Community Service within the School recognises the need for students to reach out to those less fortunate than themselves. Examples of initiatives include donations from their Startup Superstars business, book donations to fellow students and support for national disasters. Students are actively supporting the #IPledge campaign to recycle their text books so that their juniors may also make good use of them.

Celebrating Academic Excellence

NWS places great value on academic attainment. The results are excellent, positioning the School as one of the very best in Uttar Pradesh and Delhi NCR, with year on year improvements. 97% scored a distinction in the Class 12 Board examinations in 2019.

From the 2019 cohort, 35 students secured the 0.1 certificates from CBSE for scoring the highest marks in various subjects and making it in the top 0.1 percentile.

Outstanding Attainment in Competitive Examinations

Increasing numbers of students achieve success in the highly competitive examinations for places in the best further education institutions. An example of this is three students clearing the National Talent Search Examination (NTSE) to qualify for Stage 2, where 2,000 places are awarded across the whole of India. Another example would be students being regularly selected for the Kishore Vaigyanik Protsahan Yojana (KVPY).

We also commend the achievements of 8 students in 2019 who cleared the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT-JEE) Advanced Examination, giving entry to the most prestigious establishment for the study of Technology in India.

Scholarships

Acknowledging the efforts put in by students and their families in securing outstanding results in the School's internal and CBSE examinations, NWS awards several merit and need based scholarships every year. Details of the same can be obtained from the School reception desk.


The ERP system provides daily information on learning completed.

Award Winning Recognition

The International School Award (ISA)

NWS is a proud three-time recipient of the British Council International School Award from 2011-2014, 2015-2018 and 2019-2022. The International School Award (ISA) is a benchmarking scheme through which the British Council accredits schools as having an outstanding level of support for nurturing global citizenship in young people and enriching teaching and learning. ISA provides a framework for schools to develop an action plan and implement international activities throughout the year and encourages schools to collaborate with those overseas to create a rich learning experience for students through the use of ICT, creative pedagogical practices and a real context for learning.

Distinguished Performance in Academics

NWS places great value on academic attainment. The results are excellent, positioning the School as one of the very best in Uttar Pradesh and Delhi NCR, with year on year improvements. 97% scored a distinction in the Class 12 Board examinations in 2019. The School was recognised nationally in 2019 for its 'distinguished performance in academics' receiving a 'Certificate of Excellence', the Global Educators' Award from Scoo News. Concurrently awarded Category A status as a C.B.S.E. School means that NWS is providing training and mentoring for other schools to share best practice to raise attainment in other C.B.S.E. schools.

Education World Awards

NWS prides itself on its recent recognition and ranking of 2 in India for 'Design Thinking Leaders' by Education World as a School 'demonstrating extraordinary capacity to break away from rote learning and adopt pedagogies which encourage the development of the students' creative thinking, collaborative and problem-solving skills', awarded in part for the Start Up Superstars (SSS) initiative. With active learning already firmly embedded in its approaches to teaching and learning, this initiative took inspiration from the Government project of 'Make in India' and 'The School Enterprise Challenge' India. Integrated across the curriculum, students from classes 1 to 9 and 11 gain hands-on experience of planning, launching and running real businesses, which are owned and operated by them. They are sustainable and may develop year-on-year. One Business per class is ultimately chosen, with each class member having a designated role in the Business Team structure.



Co-curricular Activities

Creo Inter-School Festival

The festival hosted by NWS has various competitive, non-competitive and mix-competitive events in the fields of Photography, Fine Arts, Health and Nutrition, Public Speaking, Science & Technology, Literature and Performing Arts. The event over three days attracts over 2000 students from 50+ schools. The students get an opportunity to participate in the festival and contribute towards creativity, problem solving and innovation through collaboration.

Co-Curricular Activities

Co-curricular activities promote learning by stimulating creative thinking, improving social and organisational skills, developing interests and talents, and offering the chance to switch off and do something that is really enjoyed. In exploring all facets of their personality, students are therefore able to develop their talents and skills to the full.

Dramatics and Declamation

Students are encouraged to develop their public speaking and presentation skills through elocution, debates, plays, and the theatre. This training provides them an ideal opportunity and platform to not only discover and showcase their talents, but also to instil self-confidence.

Art and Craft

To bring out creativity, curiosity and the power of imagination within a child, our students participate in a host of art and craft projects. Students are encouraged to explore their creative talent through a variety of mediums that include clay, fabric, sand, paint, paper and many others.

Music and Dance

Music and Dance are integral parts of the curriculum, our students have the opportunity to pursue these with the help of extremely talented teachers. Specialised training is provided for both.

Sports

Students have the opportunity to take part in a range of sporting activities, both during the day and in out-of-school activities. Out-of-School activities include Basketball, Football, Cricket, Skating, Carrom, Table Tennis, Badminton and Chess.

Yoga

Our Infrastructure

Infrastructure

NWS is spread over a campus of about two acres and possesses a three storey building which houses the senior classes and the administrative block, along with a large auditorium at the lower ground level. In addition, a separate two storey building provides classrooms for the Primary and Secondary School Wings. Also housed within this building are the various Science Laboratories.

Classroom Size and Layout

Student strength varies from 30 to 38 in each CBSE classroom depending on the age of learners. Classes may occasionally be 40 in strength. In Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE) classrooms, 26 is the maximum number of students. Teachers at NWS are given the freedom to decide the layout of their classes, as per students' convenience and teaching requirements. The intention is to have a layout that supports and enhances teaching and learning while keeping it aesthetically pleasing and functional.

Indoor Facilities

All classrooms and staffrooms of the School are equipped with air conditioners to maintain ambient temperature at all times. The junior and senior blocks are built around a large playground and open assembly place with two national level basketball courts. In addition to regular classroom space for up to 1500 students (Play Group to XII), the buildings include science laboratories, seven mobile labs, visual art and music studios, audio-visual rooms, a state-of-the-art facility for videoconferencing and a well-stocked Library.

The Sky Field

The rooftop playground space of 12000 sq. ft. called the Sky Field is a new concept in urban sports education. It has been designed keeping in mind Physical Education Curriculum (PEC), a joint initiative of CBSE and British Council for Primary Classes. Students can play football, netball, softball, cricket, four squares and hopscotch alongside several other new games, introduced to focus on developing gross motor skills like balancing, body coordination and agility.

Other facilities include national level basketball courts and a badminton court. Alongside, a separate area with slides and other play equipment made with high grade non-toxic plastic with rubberised flooring is provided near the Early Years Wing.




Being a Safe School

NWS is a safe, trusting, caring and welcoming environment. Your children's safety and well-being are our highest priority. All visitors are required to register with the security guard before entering the main buildings of the School. Multi-level security systems are employed within and outside the School buildings to create a safe environment for our students. Strict security procedures are followed in case students are picked up from the School during School hours.

- The Senior Leadership Team including the Director, NWS is in School at 6:40 a.m. followed by teachers at 7:00 a.m., much before the students enter the School. Once the students leave School, the entire building is secured by the site supervisor.
- Over 150 CCTV cameras are installed across the School, including the entrances of all toilets. These are regularly monitored and maintained to ensure they are functional.
- Movement of all adults inside the School is recorded and maintained in designated registers. The School perimeter is secured and the gates in use are manned at all times.
- Student toilets are clearly demarcated and separate toilets are used by non-teaching staff.
- Sessions on Safe and Unsafe touch are also conducted for students from time to time.
- Teachers are assigned duties on vantage points during the School start time, intervals and when the School shuts.
- All buses used by NWS are owned and operated by NWS and all drivers and conductors are employed directly by NWS after careful vetting of their credentials and references.
- All buses are fitted with CCTV and GPS, which are monitored while in operation.
- Buses pick up and drop off the students inside the School premises, under the supervision of the School transport in-charge.
- All School buses have female attendants for the bus duty.

Health care

Health Care

- The school has a fully quipped medical first aid room with a qualified nurse from super speciality hospital.
- First-aid boxes are distributed throughout the School, including in the labs, each staff room and in the Wing Head's Office in the Pre-Primary section.
- In addition, parents are required to update the School with the most recent medical information as appropriate.
- Parents are informed immediately if their children are feeling unwell. They are given the option of collecting them from School or the child returning to the classroom. Parents are required to collect students from School, who are not well enough to be in the classroom. Students wait in the medical room until they are collected by their parents in order to be closely monitored.
- In principle, no medication will be administered by the School. Should a child require medication when in School, the parent is required to come to the School to administer the required dosage.
- The nurse accompanies students on school visits/excursions on Saturdays as required.
- The School also owns an ambulance to facilitate the rapid transportation of students in need to urgent medical attention to hospital.

Step 1: Get the School prospectus and application package from the School/Online.

Step 2: Schedule a test (wherever applicable) and personal interview with the Admissions Board.

Step 3: If admission is granted, submit fees and required documents at the specified date.


School Visit
